Dear Members of Trinity;

The Mitchell Daily Republic had an article this week about the proposed new casino in Oacoma being planned by Lower Brule Tribe. The casino has been an item of discussion at the last couple of Chamberlain Area Ministerial meetings. This letter has been signed by some of the ministerial members, including me, and has been forwarded to the federal gaming commission and state officials. Here is the body of the letter.

#### Dear Sirs:

We have recently learned of the Lower Brule Sioux Tribe's plans for economic development. We are encouraged at this tribes' initiative in seeking to help themselves and others economically. Their popcorn production which we understand is one of the best in the nation shows that when the tribe does something, they do it well. We were impressed with the plans for development of a travel center, hotel, restaurant, convention center West of Oacoma. We feel these businesses would not only be good for the tribe but also for the Oacoma/Chamberlain community. But we do feel the need to express our opposition to the moving of the tribe's gambling operations to this location West of Oacoma and Chamberlain, South Dakota. We feel responsible to do this because the location would be within the radius of our area churches' ministries. We as members of the group feel that we need to voice our opposition to moving in a gambling operation here. We would ask you to consider these reasons for our opposition:

1. Promotion and expansion of gambling sends a message to the youth of our community that is contrary to the work ethic we try to promote and for which our community has had a solid reputation. It promotes the idea that we can get something for nothing, which promotes idleness rather than industriousness and initiative.

2. This will create social problems with family members who do not know how to control themselves where gambling is concerned and the community will be required to pick up the cost.

3. We as pastors, priests and other Christian ministers need ever to ask the question, "What is God calling us to do?" in matters of faith and life. In this issue, it seems to us the corollary to this question is, "How shall we be our brother's keeper?" We believe the relocation of casino gambling to our community is not an action which we can endorse.

We certainly are not against economic development for the Lower Brule Sioux Tribe. We would welcome the travel center, hotel, restaurant, and convention center West of Oacoma. As stated above, we applaud the tribe's initiative and productive efforts of economic development. We believe they are on the right track except for the gambling. We would look forward to the tribe's promotion of other development ideas. But we feel we do need to voice our opposition to the gambling portion of this proposal.

Thank you for your consideration in this matter.

The comment has been made that the ministerial alliance is picking on Native Americans and the question was raised as to why we don't say something about the other gambling establishments run by whites in this area. I would like to respond personally to those charges.

First – The SD Synod of the ELCA and I personally have taken a stand against the proliferation of gambling in South Dakota over the past 30 years. This includes opposing video lottery, sale of lottery tickets including Powerball, and the increase of betting limits in Deadwood.

Second - If the ministerial alliance found out that a new restaurant in Chamberlain would be offering gambling we would also oppose it.

Third - There is not much we can do about the gambling sites that are already in existence either in Chamberlain or on the reservation but we can take a stand against the proliferation of gambling in our area.

I personally believe that gambling is a hindrance to economic development. I also know there are some of you who would disagree with me on this issue. I am always open to dialogue.

### **Quilt Making**

We are putting out a call for people to help make quilts. We are not talking about those fancy quilts that

can take a long time to make. The quilts we are talking about are simple quilts, sewn from squares of fabric, and held together with cotton thread.

Lutheran World Relief is calling for 500,000 quilts to be made in 2013. They are asking previous donors to increase their donation by 25%. This is a good time for Trinity Lutheran Church to answer the call.

The women at Kimball Protestant Parish have been making mission quilts for many years. This year they donated 150 quilts to Lutheran World Relief. Those women have a system for making quilts! They have shared two boxes of precut squares put together in packets – all ready to be sewn into a quilt top. The tops are put together, and then set aside to be assembled into quilts in February.

If you can sew a straight line, you can sew a quilt top for Lutheran World Relief. This would be a wonderful project for a beginning seamstress as well as an experienced seamstress!

Kimball women have invited us to join them in February when they assemble the quilts.

We will be collecting monies to purchase mission quilt batting, and to pay \$2.50 for each quilt to be shipped.
