Dear Members of Trinity;

It was a year ago that Margie and I were making preparation for our upcoming Reformation trip to Germany. The trip proved to be an exciting and learning adventure. Before and after the trip I had spent time learning more about the history of the reformation. Time has come to share pictures and story of our trip. We will be doing so on Sunday evening, October 27th at 6:30 pm. All who are interested, both members and non-members, are invited to attend. We will be showing pictures of some of the places we saw on our trip. We will also be telling some of the history behind the places we visited. I shared this presentation with Kiwanis and it was well received.

October 31st is the day we celebrate as Reformation Day. On that day in 1517 Martin Luther nailed the 95 thesis to the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg. It was that act that started the Protestant Reformation. Luther lived in Wittenberg for most of his life. In four years we will be celebrating the 500th Anniversary of the beginning of the reformation. One of the highlights in visiting Germany was seeing all of the churches, homes and buildings that were in existence at the time of Martin Luther that are still being used today. Many of these are in the old historic town of Wittenberg. We will be sharing pictures of some of them in our presentation.

Another highlight for me was the food (big surprise). Of course I took some pictures of the food we ate and will be sharing them with you.

Many positive comments have been received about the community service work we did as part of worship on Sunday, September 8.

Instead of hearing a sermon, we witnessed Pastor Duane bless the scarves and hats knit by Trinity members for Christmas at Sea. Then 40 some members of Trinity Lutheran church disbursed into the community to do yard work and repairs at five homes, litter patrol at city parks, clean the Treehouse storage shed, clean the inner courtyard at Sanford Long Term Care, tie a mission quilt, and paint the front deck and sort donations at Missouri Valley Crisis Center.

Members returned to church to finish the service. A lunch was then served, and we had time to visit.

Parishioners said how much they enjoyed the work that day. Some said their eyes were really opened to the needs in the community. Others said the work was not finished where they were, and they wanted to go back.

"We need to continue this work. We need to do this again," said many members of the work crews.

- a constant reminder that someone, far away, cares a lot.

SO WHAT IS THIS THANKOFFERING ALL ABOUT??

The idea of collecting donations in small offering boxes goes back to the very early 1800s, when women formed "mite" or "cent" societies to raise money. Mite boxes were given out as fundraising tools to collect pennies for the support of church projects and foreign missionaries.

These women led cent societies, platforms for social activism as well as evangelism in the 19th century, published their own literature, Bible studies and other materials advocating around issues such as child labor, literacy and prison reform. Thankoffering boxes have been going ever since.

Beginning in the late 19th century, Lutheran women were given small Thankoffering boxes to place in a special location in their homes as a visible reminder of blessings received. The concept of Thankoffering celebrations dates back more than 100 years and beyond Lutherans. At the first Thankoffering service in 1889, \$6,100 was collected. Today Women of the ELCA collects more than \$1 million in Thankofferings annually for the ministries and mission of our women's organization.

Thankofferings show gratitude for God's blessings and give us an important and tangible way to express that gratitude and to teach about stewardship. It is a tradition grounded in our celebration of community, of meeting together to joyfully give thanks for what God has given us. Giving Thankofferings is grounded in scripture and in the Women of the **ELCA** constitution. Trinity's Thankoffering service will be held on November 24. We ask that you place the Thankoffering box in a prominent place in your home and count your blessings by placing your monetary gratitude in the box. At the Thankoffering service, please bring your money to church and keep the box for the coming year.
