from the desk of ...



Dear Members and Friends of Trinity Lutheran Church,

To be honest with all of you, I struggled to come up with an idea for my article this month. Then, a morning with a fun few guys sparked some thoughts. Over the last few months, a men's bible study has been meeting early one Thursday a month to talk about various topics and pieces of scripture and how the gospel stories might relate to our everyday lives as Christians. Our time together has actually reminded me of the men in my life, and what their study of the Bible has/had meant to them.

My dad always said he was a "bad Catholic who became a good Lutheran". He didn't attend a lot of bible studies with groups of men, but he did a lot of personal bible study and surrounded himself with other men with whom he could talk about scripture and its meaning for their lives. And just recently, I found out that my grandfather, gruff though he may seem at times, spends quite a bit of his morning in intentional prayer and study of the bible. Two of the most important men in my lives, even when a group for bible study wasn't available, take and took time to do this. That just makes me proud of them and the influence they've had on me. They didn't have to know tons about the Bible before devoting time to study it. I guess, in hindsight, I wish that my dad especially would have had a group of men to do a bible study with. And it makes me thankful that Trinity now has a budding men's bible study.

Over the last few months, the group's been pretty small, but I'd like to encourage other men to join us as they are able. We meet the third Thursday of the month at 7:30 am, either at the church or at Vonnie's. We've talked about things like Samuel's call from God, the Beatitudes, and most recently, wilderness and Jesus' temptation in the wilderness after his baptism. Regular attend-

Scholarship Coffee Sundays were started Thrivent members to raise money for scholarships for Thrivent high school seniors that were going on to post-secondary education. Over the years, this


program changed to any high school senior that was a member, or their parent was a member, of the Trinity parish would get a small scholarship to help them on their journey of higher education.
