from the desk of...

Pastor Lisa

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As some of you may or may not know, I am a bit of a "nerd" about genealogy and history. I love looking at old family records, family trees, and census records as I try to trace the roots I and my family have. One piece that's still fairly jumbled for me is my family's religious history. One thing, however, I have to be very interesting: there's a whole mess of Catholics and Lutherans!

It was fun for me, as a child, to go to family events that involved church no matter which side I was going with. The Catholic Church in Redfield had been attended by my Heffernan side for a long time, and the Lutheran Church in Sioux City my Ross side is a part of holds a special place because both my parents and grandparents were married there. Both traditions are important to me, so when I learned our Reformation history, a part of me was shocked to learn just how "big of a deal" Martin Luther's words and actions were for the Roman Catholic Church of his time.

This month we celebrate the 500th anniversary of that Reformation, of the day Martin Luther posted his 95 theses on the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg, Germany. These were his grievances with the Church over the sale of indulges and other matters. That action sparked what we call the Protestant Reformation today. It ultimately divided us "protest-ants" from the Roman Catholic Church, and many traditions ended up being birthed as a result. It's a hard history for many, but it is something that Lutherans honor and remember today as we continue to proclaim that we are saved by Christ through our faith, and not by our works.

Many of you probably remember a time when Catholics and Lutherans had a really difficult time with one another because of Luther and the other reformers actions, and the ways in which the

Sept 7, 2017 - 7:00 p.m.

Devotions: The meeting was called to order, Pastor Lisa led devotions

Additions to Minutes:

The women's triennial gathering, sanctuary lights, the chair rack, church painting, and a correction to be made on the fundraising account. Mold in the bathroom, roof by front door has shingles needing repair, and outside the new door the trim is missing.

Reading of Minutes:

The minutes were read and a motion was made to accept them by Dave with Rosemary seconding. The motion passed.

Treasurer's Report:

- Nothing unusual to report.
- A noisy offering of \$57.15 was made but wrote a check for \$100.00 as per the decision of council to use Thrivent Choice Dollars to bring noisy offering to \$100 each month. This will change the balances submitted.
- Health insurance will go up around 5% for pastor and the deductible will stay the same.
- A motion to accept the report was made by Dave and seconded by Terrold. The motion passed.

Correspondence: Regular mailers were received.

Committee Reports:

PROPERTY

- The church cleanup went well. About 30 people helped. During the cleanup, mold in the bathroom, roof damage, and the need to finish the trim on the new door was discovered. Nate will be asked to return to finish the trim and see what might be done for the mold and roof shingles.
- Sanctuary lights needs to be replaced. A book with possible options was obtained, but most wouldn't work because they hang down too low. Track lighting was proposed as a possible remedy. It was proposed that the Property Committee consult with Cozine Electric to look for other options.
- Painting of the exterior of the church is needed, particularly the trim. Neoma will oversee this.
- The chair racks are hard to use, so Rosemary is proposing to purchase a rack that will hold 80 chairs, the funds to be taken out of the Building fund account. Dave made the motion to purchase this and Neoma seconded it. The motion passed.

WORSHIP

- Kick-off Service is this weekend at the American Creek park at 10:30.
- The bulletin will be experimenting with its format soon.
- Projection of the words in the bulletin on a screen was discussed. How feasible it may be to do at a point in the future will be looked at.

STEWARDSHIP

• No report.

EDUCATION

- Wowsome Wednesday started last night. There is a big preschool class of 9 kids. Another teacher would be a blessing for that class. Mary B. will line up meals, and as of right now there is a lot of openings for this. There are about 35 kids in the various classes.
- The kids will be singing at the Kick-off service and the 3rd graders will get their bibles. Setup will begin at 9:30 that day.

- Updated the prayer list.
- Initial planning for the scholarship brunch on the 24th of September.
- Prepared cards to go out to congregation members.

Pastor's Report:

- Traveled to Chicago for an ELCA Disability Ministries Advisory Table meeting.
- Prepared for the fall church season

- A trio of women want to go to a mother's and daughter's retreat out at outlaw ranch and would like some help with the fees. They are requesting \$300.00 from the camper fund to help cover part of the cost. Dave motioned to accept this and Terrold seconded. The motion passed.
- The WELCA Triennial gathering was attended by Rosemary and Cynthia and as representatives of the congregation, the feeling is that they should be compensated, in part, for their participation. A request of \$200 from the Thrivent Choice Dollars for each of them was proposed to offset their expenses. Terrold made the motion and Neoma seconded it. The motion passed.
