Twenty-five years ago the LCA (Lutheran Church in America) and the TALC (The American Lutheran Church) as well as a small group of former LC-MS congregations joined together to form the ELCA (Evangelical Lutheran Church in America).

Anniversaries are worth celebrating. But the ELCA decided to celebrate our anniversary differently. Our church is encouraging every congregation in the ELCA to celebrate our 25th anniversary on September 8th. Further, every congregation is encouraged to celebrate by doing some community services projects.

This might seem to be a strange way to celebrate but it is an important way to remember our history. The Lutheran church has always been a church that has been socially minded. Our Lutheran church formed a social service agency in South Dakota to care for unwed mothers and unwanted children many years ago. Over the years their services have broaden to provide counseling, elderly care, facilities to help troubled youth, consumer credit counseling, etc. Many states have Lutheran Social Service organizations.

The Lutheran church was on the forefront of education with the starting of colleges and seminaries. One could also mention Lutheran World Relief, Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Service, Lutheran Disaster Response and Good Samaritan Society. Numerous hospitals throughout the United States were also started by Lutherans. You get the picture; the Lutheran church has always been concerned about social needs.



GATHER FOR ACTION AND FAITH -BIBLE STUDY

Trinity women study the Bible with the aid of "Gather for Action and Faith," a magazine published 11 times a year.

A new series of studies begins in September – "In Good Company: Stories of Biblical Women."

Company's coming! Bible study author Kay Ward, a bishop in The Moravian Church, has invited nine women from the Old Testament, several from the New Testament, and a handful of women she knows to stop in for a visit. They will be companions with us each month, long enough for us to get to know them and to also get to know ourselves a bit better. Their stories will draw us into Bible study, worship with the Psalms, and opportunities to tell us our own stories.

ALL WHO HUNGER, GATHER GLADLY

This summer Trinity women studied a three-part Bible lesson – All Who Hunger, Gather Gladly.

The three lessons were titled: "Hungry Hearts," "Do We Have Enough?" and "All Ate and Were Fed."

The lessons centered on the text in Matthew, Mark and Luke where Jesus sent out his disciples without any "supplies" to preach and heal. He then invited them to come back and tell what happened.

They did that, and so many people gathered who needed to be fed – and they were through the miracle of the loaves and fishes.

The Bible study concluded with the collection of nonperishable food our local food pantries, and a presentation about the dynamics of hunger in South Dakota and the ELCA's Evangelical Lutheran Church in America) efforts to fight hunger on a local, state and international basis.

The women looked at the challenges of feeding a family while working a low-income job.

Feeding South Dakota, a statewide feeding agency, has declared September as hunger action month. They tell us "hunger is a solvable issue if we work together."

Here are some of the statistics Feeding South Dakota has gathered: 14.6% of individuals in South Dakota live at or below the poverty level, one out of eight people are food insecure, one out of five children are at risk of going hungry, three counties in South Dakota are the poorest in the United States, four South Dakota counties are in the top ten poorest in the United States, eight South Dakota counties are among the nation's 30 poorest counties, 40% of children receive free and reduced school lunch.

In Chamberlain, over 47% of all students at our elementary school receive free and reduced lunch.

Feeding South Dakota knows that 49% of families they serve are currently working and their average income is \$970 per month.

Trinity women worked on a budgeting exercise for a family of three people using a typical low-income salary of \$8.25 per hour, 40 hours per week.

Notice there is nothing budgeted for food, clothing, school supplies, coats, shoes, winter boots, car payment or repairs, insurance, or anything else. This is the reality of trying to live on a low-income salary.

Low incomes are one of the main reasons people need to visit a food pantry. They are often strapped for cash because of a car break down, absence from work due to illness, or needing to catch up on their utility bills.

Please be as generous as you can. We have two food pantries in town – ROCS pantry at the courthouse is open Monday through Friday, 9 a.m. to 2 p.m.; and the St. James food pantry is open Mondays 10 a.m. to noon.

You can learn more about ELCA World Hunger, which addresses the root causes of hunter and poverty by checking their website. ELCA World Hunger provides relief, development, education and advocacy. They respond to neighbors around the corner and around the work. They have resources to tell the story and give congregations ideas for combating hunger. You will find them at www.elca.org, click on "Our Faith In Action" and "Responding to the World."
