from the desk of...

Pastor Lisa

Dear Members of Trinity Lutheran Church,

Grace and peace! June has been quite a busy month for many here at Trinity, and I want to say a special thank you to everyone for your support as I have been preparing for my ordination on June 28th. As I write this, I am about a week and a half from the “big day” and look forward to it with joy and hope. I also very much look forward to continuing our ministry together.

One of the scripture texts I have chosen for my ordination is 1 Corinthians 12:12-27. It has been a favorite of mine for quite a long time, and, I feel, really speaks to what it means to be the body of Christ in any and all contexts congregational and otherwise.

In this text, Paul writes that no single part of the physical body can tell another that it has no need of it or no value. *“Indeed, the body does not consist of one member but of many. If the foot would say, ‘Because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body’, that would not*

make it any less a part of the body... But as it is, God arranged the members in the body, each one of them, as he chose. If all were a single member, where would the body be? As it is, there are many members, yet one body.” (1 Cor. 12: 14-15, 18-20). This text reminds us how essential each person is, with their given talents, gifts, and personal identities, to the body of Christ, the church. I love it for that reason, but also for another.

One thing I strongly believe in is empowering the laity, all of you, for service together. With those gifts and talents each one of us has been given, we can live, serve, work, and worship together as we find ways to spread the gospel and help others in our community. But, if one member or person is told they do not have a place, the “body” suffers as does the mission of the church.

One of my hopes and prayers for this new phase in our time together is that all may be

BIBLE STUDY – SUMMER 2014: OF MANY GENERATIONS – MARY, ELIZABETH, LYDIA

We are women of “of many generations”, many ages, many places, and many experiences. We have a calling to Diane Jacobson, come, learn, and serve together, as well as to rebuild, repair, and restore not only our own relationships, but also the world around us.

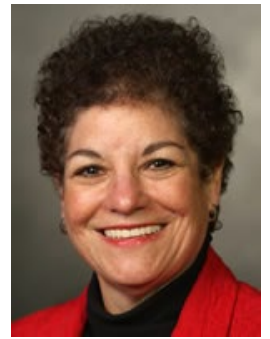
To do this we look to Scripture for stories that take us into this calling. We look for stories of women who come together, women who understand themselves to be part of a multi-generational community and who have known both challenge and joy.

“I can think of no better stories than the two we will read together this summer. In the first session, we will look at the remarkable meeting of two generations of women in Mary and Elizabeth,” wrote the author of the study, Dr. Diane Jacobson, pictured at right. “We will look at their sto-

ries and come to know them. Then in the next session we will explore Mary’s song that she sings in response both to Elizabeth’s greeting and to all that has happened to her.

“In the final session, we will turn to the story of Lydia that also explores a gathering of women that raises up the foundation of many generations.”

Diane Jacobson is professor emeritus of Old Testament at Luther Seminary in St. Paul, MN, where she taught from 1982-2010. Director of the Book of Faith Initiative for the ELCA, she holds a Ph.D. from Union Theological University, New York, NY.

There was some discussion on verifying Trinity and prospective members' addresses, phone numbers and e-mail addresses. Some addresses have already been completed.

The Fifth Sunday potluck brunch will be June 29. Jean Blackwell and Dianne Graves will be in charge of set up. They will also check and make sure there are enough paper products on hand.

The fish fry was the next topic of discussion. A sign up sheet will be passed. Terry Hines may be able to help. Vicar Lisa contacted Jim Klages to help with the fish fry. The fish fry will be held 5:30 p.m. Wednesday, July 16 with the council and deacons meeting after the meal. The deacons discussed setting a tentative date for next year's fish fry.

If this date does not work, then Sunday, July 27 was the second choice. Maria will check into the availability of the community center on Aug. 10 and report back. A silent auction could also be held. Ideas tossed around included pancakes, sausage, fruit or juice or egg bakes as a brunch selection. The deacons were leaning more toward the pancake, sausage brunch.
