Dear Members and Friends of Trinity,

nyone remember the silly song "Head, shoulders, knees, and toes"? Well, I can't get it out of my head today as look ahead to our Lenten season. That silly song creeps in, I think, because our Lenten theme this year will be "Open My Life, Lord". Each week at the Wednesday night service we will be hearing from people, caricatures of ourselves really, as they help us explore how it is that God opens our eyes, ears, hands, hearts, and lives. So I guess, in a way, this silly song holds more meaning for me this year.

As we move into this Lenten season; the time of preparation for Christ's death and resurrection, I invite you to reflect on the ways and/or places you've seen God giving you a bit of a nudge, perhaps where God has opened your eyes, ears, etc., and made you see just what this thing called being a Christian is all about. We won't always see in the moment what God is doing,

but we know that God is there and is doing a new work in us all the time.

Old Business was discussed:

- Judy will send a card to Remington Rossow who was hospitalized for an appendectomy.
- Ideas for family time were discussed--this would be in February--either the 21st or 28th. We will decide at a later date. It was discussed to have a movie night like last year with chili being served. Ice cream could be served also. The movie, McFarland, was discussed as a possible movie to be shown.
- Deacons will help set up the potluck after the annual meeting on January 31.

The meeting ended with the group reciting the Lord's Prayer.
