Guest presenter:

Jeff Tveit reported on the endowment fund. Main topic discussed was how much funds from it might be available and how to utilize the funds.

Treasurer's Report:

- The was no real changes to the bank accounts. Fundraising went up some and the checking went down an equal amount.
- Some expenses included \$600.00 to Kelly, \$500 to the Synod, \$388.00 for new vacuum cleaner and the Burke Oil bill was \$914.00. With these the expenses were slightly higher than income.

WORSHIP

- The committee will be meeting this week on Thursday to plan Holy Week and Easter services.
- Gideons would like to come on the second Sunday in April.

EDUCATION

- Final Milestone ministry recognition next Sunday with the preschool and kindergarten group.
- Camp night will be on 3/11.
- \$600 was received from the Christian Motorcycle luncheon.

Deacons:

- Worked on the game night stuff and the prayer list. Discussed the Trinity scholarship fund and their desire to be on the review committee.
- They elected their leadership. Dotty was elected as the president, Judy as vice president. The secretary is Deb Selland and the Treasurer will serve as the liaison between the Deacons and them.

Pastor's Report:

- April offering teller and the devotion will be done by Rosemary.


