Pastor Young's Sharing Corner

Journeys of Encountering Epiphany Moments

A long time ago three wise men journeyed to Bethlehem, following a star. They were led to a small, insignificant town where no one would expect the promised one, the *Messiah* could be found. However, that was where the wise men found Jesus Christ. We often call this moment "Epiphany" or "Aha! Moment."

The word "epiphany" comes from a Greek word meaning "to show," "to make known" or "to reveal." As Christians, we are also following a star. Like the wise men, sometimes the star leads us where we experience Epiphany moments. Through these moments, we are transformed and led to pathways of light.

The season of Epiphany begins January 6th and lasts until Ash Wednesday. The eastern part of the early church began observing Epiphany as a feast to commemorate Jesus' baptism. This tradition has been passed down through liturgical churches, so the first Sunday of Epiphany is observed as the baptism of Our Lord Jesus.

Light is the main theme of Epiphany. The light of Christ will shine through the darkness of our hearts. We need the light every day because darkness continues to try to extinguish the light. We struggle with darkness, but it will never overcome the light (John 1:5).

Phyllis Anderson who was the President of Pacific Lutheran Theological Seminary (2005-2013) said, "Christ shines most clearly for us when we are most keenly aware of the depth of human suffering, loneliness, grief and shame. Don't be afraid of the dark. It is where you find God."

What is your Epiphany? Which star are you following? In what unexpected places have you discovered God?



December 5, 2021 Sunday at 10:30 a.m.

Present: Terrold Menzie, Sharmel Olson, Dick Feltman, Mark Huber, Kathi Anderson

Absent: Mike Bunker, Declan Tveit

Devotions: The meeting was called to order, Terrold led the devotions.

Additions to agenda: No additions were made to the agenda.

Reading of Minutes: The minutes were reviewed. A correction of having the Synod council sending an observer to our council meeting and not a member of another church was made to the minutes. Another correction indicates that the confirmed kids should be the correct phrase and not the confirmation kids. Terrold made the motion to accept the minutes with the correction and Kathi seconded it. It passed.

Treasurer's Report:

- The transfers made during the month between the accounts was provided.
- The possibility of having the Christmas offering go towards the purchase of the panels was discussed. No resolution was made.
- The furnace was looked at by an AC company and some discoveries were made. The panel needed to be replaced and filters were obtained of the correct size. The bill will appear when it arrives. The furnace should stay at 68 degrees during the winter months while during the summer 72 was recommended by the company.
- Kathi made the motion to accept the report and Terrold seconded it. It passed.

Correspondence: Nothing to report.

Committee Reports:

PROPERTY

- The organ process was pending now on the Zion's decision on what price they want to pay. Their church meeting will determine this.
- The new quote for the panel was provided. It included a few additional panels to cover more area. The motion to accept the quote and order them was made by Terrold to pay for them using \$2,500.00 in Building fund, \$2,500.00 from the Thrivant fund and any additional from the fund raiser Jeff is planning. Any money the fundraising collects that goes over the cost will be put back into the Building fund. Kathi seconded the motion and it passed.

WORSHIP

• The online live version of the services has had to use Jeff's Facebook account and a donated tablet, and the mounting of it to a tripod is no longer available. The technology group will be asked to look into this. The sound was stated to be soft then loud and fluctuating between the two.

STEWARDSHIP

• They still will need to meet to discuss the endowment portion of the panels.

EDUCATION

• Practice for the Christmas play is coming along fine. The date is set for December 19th after services and it will be followed by a potluck.

Deacons: Putting stuff together with the Wowsome classes. Asking for \$260 to make kits which will come from the Thrivent to help with expenses. Kathi made the motion to allow this and Terrold seconded it. The motion passed.

New Business:

- The Wowsome Wednesday Progam and Potluck on December 19 was discussed. Deacons will help set up and serve. Goodie bags will be distributed to the Wowsome kids following the program. Bags will be put together on December 18 at 10:00 with fruit, candy and an ornament.

The meeting ended with a devotion read by Aaryn Schaub.
