Pastor Young's Sharing Corner

"Dreaming Dreams and Seeing Visions"



Compelled by Peter's first sermon, I am dreaming dreams and seeing visions. As I was reading Acts 2, I questioned myself, "Can we dream dreams and see visions?" My answer was "of course."

We will celebrate Pentecost on June 5. The word "Pentecost" means "fiftieth day." Thus,

Pentecost Day is celebrated exactly 50 days after Passover or seven weeks after Easter. The color of Pentecost Day is red, symbolizing the fire that appeared to the disciples assembled in the upper room when the Holy Spirit was poured out upon them. With the Spirit they received, the followers of Jesus had enough courage to preach the good news (Luke 24:48-49; Acts 2).

This is why Pentecost is sometimes called the birthday of the Church. Thus, church is not the building, but rather we are the church. Our vocation, therefore, is not just to go to church but also to be the church at all times and in all places. On our gathering to worship on Sunday, we are a "gathered church" and on our leaving with blessings to share good news and serve the Lord, we are a "scattered church." Therefore, Kelly A. Fryer puts it another way: "The church is the people of God, out there on the street, in the world, in the midst of everyday life."

The Pentecost season lasts until the first Sunday of Advent, taking the entire second half of the church year. It is a season of growing, and green leaves and plants are symbols of the Pentecost season. We are going to enter the season of growth. What does this mean for us? The Spirit calls us to dream dreams and see visions.

In the first century, the followers of Jesus gathered in the upper room privately with fear. However, after receiving the Holy Spirit, they came out from the private room and preached publicly, testifying about Jesus. Created by God and empowered by the Holy Spirit, we are also called and sent to bear witness to Jesus' resurrection, participating in God's mission. To grow, I invite you to dwell in the Word and discern what God is up to right now in us, in our church and in our community.

The apostle Peter boldly preached, quoting the Prophet Joel's proclamation: "Your sons and daughters will prophesy, your young men will see visions, your old men will dream dreams" (Acts 2:17). To join the prophet Joel, let's dream dreams and see visions. To this end, all we need to do is to believe that Spirit of the living God is in us. Furthermore, let the Spirit of the living God melt us, mold us, fill us, and use us. I would like to challenge you with a question, "Are you daring to dream dreams and see visions?"




