- Discussion resumed on budgetary changes.
- Secretary pay discussion was held and Pastor will set up a meeting to review and make recommendation
- Rosemary reported that a bill in the amount of \$2800 was received for driveway repair
- Motion to accept November Treasurer Report made by Dick and second by Noah. All in favor, the motion carried.

**Adjournment:** The meeting adjourned at 12:30 PM Meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.


