Greetings From Pastor Paula

This message is part of the sermon that Pastor Robert Wakefield gave to the congregation of Holy Trinity Lutheran Church in Frederiksted, Saint Croix Virgin Islands on December 1, 2024. I feel the message is worth sharing with you as we begin this Advent Season.

The Holy gospel according to Luke the 21st chapter. (Luke 21:25-36)

It happens the same way every year.

Just as the Christmas lights & trees are about to be prepared, & friends & families plan happy gatherings... the gospel readings disturb our peace: "There will be great earthquakes, famines & pestilences... Signs in the sun, moon & stars. On the earth nations will be in anguish & perplexity at the roaring of the sea. People will faint from what they see even the heavens will be shaken."

I can hear people thinking: **PLEASE!** "Not at my Christmas party." But today **IS** the **FIRST SUNDAY IN AD-VENT**, December 1, 2024. If we don't hear the doom from Luke, then we hear it from Matthew or Mark.

The color of the season isn't the red of Santa's suit or the green of freshly-cut evergreen trees, or the white of snowy tinsel.

It's the blue of the sky to which Jesus calls us to lift our eyes in anticipation.

Today's Gospel reading is NOT about angels, shepherds



or a baby in a manger. Rather it describes times of great destruction... the end times... the End of The Age before the Son of Man returns to rule. 2 weeks ago — in the Gospel of Mark — we heard Jesus predict the destruction of **THE JERUSALEM TEMPLE**.

Today, the 1st Sunday of Advent marks the beginning of a New Church Year. This church year, most of our Gospel Readings will come from Luke.

Interestingly, just before — just preceding — Today's gospel reading from Luke, Luke (ALSO) Tells us of Jesus predicting **THE DESTRUCTION OF THE TEMPLE.**

Both gospel writers were right. A generation after Jesus' Crucifixion — in 70 A.D. — the Romans Sacked & Burned the Temple. And Just as Jesus said, Not one stone was left standing on another, If you were a 1st Century Jew that would be about The Worst Thing You Could Imagine.

But in today's Gospel Jesus predicts **THINGS WOULD GET EVEN** Worse... **NOT ONLY** will the temple be Sacked & Burned **BUT** there will be **COSMIC CALAMITY**... All creation will come unhinged! The heavens will shake. The sea will roar & foam, & fear will be in every heart.

But before that cosmic calamity happens Jesus says things will get Really **REALLY** Bad for Israel.. And there won't be anything they can do to stop the tide of destruction...

And again, Jesus was right... after the destruction of the temple things went from bad to worse. To add insult to injury, the Roman general, **TITUS**, had a statue of Caesar — who claimed to be God — erected in the courtyard of the burned-out temple. (in A.D. 70) ...many Jews fled Jerusalem to a mountain fortress Herod had built — called MA-SADA — where they barricaded themselves against the Romans.

The Romans followed them & laid siege to Masada. For 3 years the Jews held out behind those strong walls until the Romans built an earthen ramp up to the top of the fortress walls. When they finally breached the walls & stormed the fortress, instead of the fierce fight they were expecting, there was no resistance. Every Jew was already dead.

? Why were they dead? When they saw they couldn't resist the Romans any further, they made a radical decision. Unwilling to be taken captive, they chose to die as a free people by taking their own lives. The few remaining Jews who hadn't been holed-up in Masada were Deported & Scattered to the 4 Winds.

Talk about Darkness!! If this is the beginning of "The Season To Be Jolly", the Church sure has a funny way of gettin' into it. But the truth is:

ADVENT ISN'T A "SEASON TO BE JOLLY, with Mistletoe & Holly."

ADVENT IS A CALL TO HOPE... especially for those facing dark, hard, danger-

ous times... including us. And if you think that doesn't include you, I wonder where you've been getting your news!

So... If things are going just fine for you... If you've never faced tragedy in your life... & are sure you'll never experience that kind of deep darkness... I suppose you can tune out at this point & go over your Christmas shopping list, & let visions of sugar-plums dance in your head.

But... if you carry the scars of grief, trouble, or have the sneaking suspicion that you may yet walk thru the valley of the shadow of death you might want to listen.

Someone tried to put some humor into their commentary about very dark times

when they said: "If you can keep your head when all about you are losing theirs...... you just don't understand the situation!" We can laugh because there is plenty going on in our world & in our nation which warrants concern... & even fear.

But Jesus **ISN'T** telling us to be afraid. In fact he is saying something quite different.

He says: **NO!**... It's the others who don't understand the situation.

He says: The truth is... when all you can see is gloom & doom, when the whole universe seems to be coming to pieces, stand up... raise your heads because your redemption is drawing near! I'm not saying that God wills Disaster **BUT** rather when darkness closes in & there's nothing you can do, **YOU ARE NOT ALONE.**

When things are really bad & you don't have a shred of hope in anything **YOU** can do — you can still lift up your head & trust the One who will ultimately redeem you.....

You watch your home & your hopes blow away in a hurricane or as so many Californians did not long ago, burn-up in a firestorm... & there's nothing you can do but watch it all go.

Or maybe... IT REALLY IS THE END!!! The earth shakes... & you're powerless to stop it. The stars fall from heaven... the sea roars... & everything comes unhinged.

? WHAT DO YOU DO THEN? Jesus says: "Raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near." Jesus says: "Raise your head..." ...not because you're strong... or can work yourself out of a tight spot... BUT because you trust Jesus... who says: "Your redemption is drawing near." **GOD IS FAITHFUL!**

The Christian hope **ISN'T** in What **WE CAN DO**, but in **WHAT GOD** has done and will **DO** for us. It's God who loved the world so much He gave His only Son for us when we were hopelessly mired in sin & shame. It's God who thru Jesus Christ gives us victory... ...even over death!

This is the Sunday for the Candle of **HOPE! ?WHAT IS THE HOPE? JESUS IS OUR HOPE!**

ADVENT CALLS US TO LOOK UP, CONFIDENT & HOPEFUL.

Not fearfully wondering & calculating but working & praying.

GOD Calls US TO BE FAITHFUL AT OUR POSTS thru all the ups & downs... the good & the bad the fears & foreboding & the times of Joy & celebration working & worshiping, loving & serving, giving & building...... & inviting people to the shining hope we have in Christ.

In the name of Jesus. Amen.
